



# Camp Kettle Run

## Check-In and Check-Out Process

### Check-In:

Troops or groups can start arriving to camp at 5:00pm on Friday evening. You should not plan on arriving any earlier. Early arrivals must be pre-approved by submitting a request to [customercare@gscsnj.org](mailto:customercare@gscsnj.org). One representative should call the Ranger and inform them of your arrival.

Depending on your arrival, the Ranger will come to check you in either Friday night or Saturday morning. The Ranger will collect your Camp Site Roster and any outstanding paperwork. The Ranger will inform you at this time if there are any fire restrictions for the camp grounds and inquire about your estimated time of departure.

Two vehicles carrying your gear may enter your campsite. All other vehicles, including pizza delivery, should be directed to the parking lots. Please park vehicles in one of two designated parking lots. Two vehicles may be left at each camp site for emergency use only. Vehicles should not be used to transport individuals from activity to activity.

Upon departure, please call the Camp Ranger to arrange drop off of the Council Camp Report and a quick inspection of your campsite. The following must be completed before calling the Ranger for check-out:

- ❑ Sweep pavilions, bathrooms, cabins, acorn huts, and tent platforms or common areas used
- ❑ Wipe down all countertops and tables
- ❑ Turn down thermostats in any buildings used
- ❑ Remove all food and personal items from the camp site and refrigerators
- ❑ Discard all trash from the campsite in designated dumpsters located in the parking lots

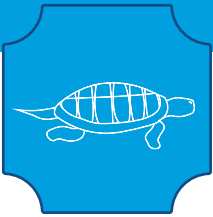

## Health & Safety Reminders:

Please review the materials from your Council's Troop Camper Certification Course (or equivalent) prior to your trip. Make sure you, your girls, and your volunteers are familiar with the site and any emergency systems.

Here are some quick reminders for a safe and fun camp weekend:

- Practice a fire drill and go over lost camper procedures with the entire group
- Identify adults in camp and know what to do if a stranger comes into camp
- Avoid animals that wander into your campsite
- Remove trash before you go to bed and before you leave the campsite
- Alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or firearms are not permitted on camp property
- To reduce the risk of visiting animals and bugs, keep all food and scented toiletries out of your tents and acorns
- Follow all Leave No Trace principles
- Use the Buddy System
- Review Council COVID Policy
