



Camp Sacajawea's Summer Group Camping FAQs

This summer, Sacajawea was chosen to pilot the new Summer Group Camping programming. That means things are a little different this year for any of our overnight programs from previous summers. Here are some answers to questions that you might have:

1. What is Group Camping?

- a. Troops and groups of girls coming to camp with their adults (registered and background checked) for a week of fun in the trees at Camp Sacajawea.

2. Why do the adults need to come with the girls?

- a. We wanted to give a great outdoor experience for troops and groups taking their first trip outdoors and to provide an awesome camping option for troops that may have some experience, but want to come and have a fun weekend without all the planning on the troop leaders.

3. Will there be opportunities for the adults to have fun too?

- a. Yes! We will have some times throughout the week for the leaders to have a break and get to know one another while the girls are having fun with an activity with the staff.
- b. Adults will also have training opportunities during the week to get their First Aid/CPR, Outdoor, and Archery Level One Trainings and Certificates.

4. What if I can't stay the whole week as an adult?

- a. That is ok! If you have someone to swap out with, they will be able to come in at no additional charge to take your place, we just need to know who it is in advance so we can make sure that all their CampDoc paperwork is complete.
- b. Groups just need to ensure that they have enough adults to cover the GSUSA ratios for their groups.

5. Is the price different?

- a. For girls, the price is the same as last year (\$495). For the adults we are offering it at a reduced rate of \$235.

6. Is Council Cares available?

- a. YES! Council Cares is available for girls AND adults coming to have fun at Sacy!

7. What kinds of activities will be available for the girls this summer

- a. All of your camp favorites will still be available: Archery, Boating, Swimming, Rock Wall, Zip Line, Nature and Crafts. This year we are even adding a new Low Ropes Challenge course for your group to practice their balance and team building skills throughout the week.

8. Is Day Camp running this same way?

- a. No, Day Camp is running in the traditional manner, where the girls come independently and are in staffed units for the day.
